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HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Bridge Inventory & Inspection Consulting Contract

Mr. Brad Davis requested approval of the LPA/Consultant Contract with United Consulting for bridge inventory and inspection. Added costs were necessary due to the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) evaluating all structures for load ratings and more in depth requirements for scour assessment. The not to exceed cost is \$580,888 for the 2017-2019 program. Heirbrandt moved to approve. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Davis noted the actual costs per structure inspection without the additional imposed INDOT requirements only increased \$37 from previous agreements.

Martin Marietta Conveyor Inspection Agreement

Davis recommended approval of the routine inspection agreement (HCHD #A-17-0001) with United Consulting and Martin Marietta for the conveyor over 160th Street. The conveyor is up and running. Heirbrandt so moved. Altman seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

On-Call Services Agreement

Davis recommended approval of the On-Call Services Agreement with Beam, Longest and Neff, LLC, (BLN) these hourly rates have not been updated since 2013/2014. BLN is being used for environmental mitigation on the 96th Street/Towne Road project. Altman asked if their overhead rate is consistent with other firms? Davis replied yes, it has increased from the previous agreement but it is not inconsistent with what is happening with overhead rates. Altman thinks it is ludicrous to have that variable rate on any contract. Dillinger moved to approve. Heirbrandt seconded. We are under Army Corps of Engineer deadlines and we are moving quickly to meet those deadlines. Altman asked if there is any federal or state requirement that we do our rate system that way? Davis did not think so. Altman requested on other contracts we go to a straight hourly rate. She would like to have consistency on hourly rates depending on qualifications and experience. Heirbrandt did not have a problem with that. Motion carried unanimously.

Traffic Study Correspondence

Davis requested approval of the list of correspondence concerning investigations on Hamilton County Roads dated January 9, 2017. Heirbrandt so moved. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

- Shirlee M. Cooper concerning street lights in Hortonville, Washington Township. Chatham Hills is inside the City of Westfield's corporate limits and as such are outside of the county's jurisdiction and the county has no knowledge of who is paying for the lights. No action will be taken by the county.

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- Carol Willis concerning permitted left turn on 146th Street and Cumberland Road in Noblesville Township. Highway staff will continue to look into converting the protected only left turns to protected/permissive left turns but at this time they are not sure when the signal will be modified.
- Sean Mulholland concerning flashing yellow left turn at 146th Street and Promise Road, Noblesville Township. Highway staff continues to look into converting the protected only left turns to protected/permissive left turns but at this time are not sure when the signal will be modified.
- Deputy David Needham concerning speed limit signs on Horton Road in Washington Township. The speed limit on Horton Road from 1630' south of 206th Street to 2780' north of 206th Street should be 45 mph with the rest of the road segment left at the state maximum speed limit for a rural road. New signs will be installed within the next couple of weeks and the old signs will be removed at the same time.

Official Action – Horton Road

Davis requested approval of the Official Action adjusting the speed limits on Horton Road as previously approved. Heirbrandt so moved. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution 01-09-17-01, Construction of Road Improvements

Mr. Michael Howard presented Resolution 01-09-17-01, A Resolution of the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County Agreement to Construction Road Improvements as part of the 276th Street project. Right-of-way needs to be acquired from the Indiana State Armory Board, they have proposed they are willing to dedicate that land without compensation if the county would agree at some time in the future to construct a dedicated left hand turn lane for eastbound traffic into the armory's new site which is approximately one-quarter mile east of US 31. [2:23:05] Dillinger moved to waive the rules on Resolution 01-09-17-01. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Dillinger moved to approve Resolution 01-09-17-01 on first reading. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

146th Street Yellow Flashers

Altman stated we keep being asked to put protected yellow flashers on 146th Street, can we start the process of asking for Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funding from the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to get those in place? Davis replied we have upgraded all that we can. Altman confirmed this is a foundation issue? Davis replied those are the ones on the extension to the east. Altman asked if this is something that would qualify? Davis replied it might, they will check into it.

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COMMISSIONER COMMITTEE REPORTS

SR 37 Update

Altman noted she and Heirbrandt attended the SR 37 corridor update meeting and we are progressing well. As with any other project there will be some bumps in the road but hopefully we will get them under control. Heirbrandt added they have done a really good job with the communication process, not only with elected officials and highway personnel but also with the business sector and residents. They have done an excellent job with their communications plan.

ATTORNEY

Ordinance 01-09-17-A, Procurement Policy for Federal Grants

Howard presented Ordinance 01-09-17-A, An Ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County Approving Procurement Policy for Federal Grants effective January 1, 2017. Altman confirmed this is a pre-condition in obtaining federal funds. Dillinger moved to waive the rules on Ordinance 01-09-17-A to adopt on first reading. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Dillinger moved to approve Ordinance 01-09-17-A. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION

Public Safety Radio Project VHF Equipment Upgrade

Mr. Michael Snowden presented the last contingency item associated with the Public Safety Radio Project, an upgrade of the VHF equipment on the 630 foot tower in the amount of \$29,717.26. This equipment will be added to the yearly maintenance fee and the budget can support this increase moving forward. Heirbrandt so moved. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Safety System Administrator Training

Snowden requested permission to allow James Miller, System Administrator, to drive the county vehicle to Schaumburg, Illinois in late January for training. Heirbrandt so moved. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Memorandum of Understanding – Madison County

Mr. Dan Stevens requested approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Madison County concerning transfer of some radio equipment. This MOU was approved last year but the amount of equipment and serial numbers have changed. Dillinger so moved. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

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2017 Orthophotography Contract

Mr. Chris Mertens requested the Professional Services Contract with the Indiana Office of Technology, Geographic Information Office for 2017 Orthophotography. All municipalities have verified they will participate and their cost share amounts. Altman asked if we have the ability to hold release until the monetary share is in place? Mertens replied we do and have done so in the past. Heirbrandt moved to approve. Dillinger seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Demolition of Senior Citizens Recycling Center

Mr. Steve Wood requested approval to demolish the old Senior Citizens recycling center for a cost of \$25,000. The back wall is blown out, concrete flooring is still good but has rot around the bottom of it. Water has been disconnected and they are working on disconnecting the power. The sewer line will be plugged. All equipment has been removed from the building. The slab will be torn out and it will be filled in with stone. Dillinger so moved. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Weights & Measures State Conference

Stevens reported Cary Woodward has requested permission for himself, Steve Nagy and Mike Thomas to attend the State Weights & Measures Conference to be held in Nashville, Indiana February 21-24, 2017. The cost is minimal. This will be Mr. Woodward's last conference and as a former Association President he would like the opportunity to introduce Nagy to the association leadership. Dillinger moved to approve. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Access to Locker Room

Stevens reported former Judge Pflieger has requested permission to access the Judicial Center locker room at times when he may be in the building in between hearings when he goes out to run. Altman asked if he is a Senior Judge? Stevens replied that was not mentioned in his request. Heirbrandt asked if he would be an employee? Stevens replied no, he would be a private attorney. Concern was expressed that this was an exception to the current policy of county employees only. Sheriff Bowen added he has retired in good standing and has no cause for safety concerns. Howard stated if he was a Senior Judge this would be different. We don't have many retirees running five miles a day. Wood said of all the people that use that locker room Judge Pflieger is the one that cleans it the most, it will not put an extra burden on his staff. Dillinger moved to approve as a retiree of the county. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

AIC Legislative Conference

Stevens reported the Association of Indiana Counties (AIC) Conference is scheduled for January 31 and February 1, 2017. Stevens asked if any Commissioners are planning on attending? Heirbrandt will be attending through his work.

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Public Safety Communications ADA Accessibility

Stevens reported Public Safety Communications has hired a person confined to a wheelchair, Director Wood and Safety Risk Manager Papineau are reviewing specific building modifications that might be required to accommodate this employee. Wood reported they have requested someone review the building for ADA requirements. Heirbrandt requested this information be communicated with the architect on the jail expansion project. They have requested Papineau obtain a price for a man lift for the stairwell in case there was an accident and to train the staff on getting all handicapped individuals out of the building.

Community Action of Greater Indianapolis Board

Stevens reported that Delaware Township Trustee Driskell contacted the Commissioners regarding Hamilton County getting our fair allocation of grants from the Community Action of Greater Indianapolis Board. Stevens has contacted the Board President to obtain the description of the board member duties. Commissioners consensus was to appoint Debbie Driskell to serve on that Board if an appointment is allowed.

AIC Award Plaque Presentations

Stevens reminded the Commissioners that the AIC plaques need to be presented to the City of Fishers, City of Noblesville and Senator Kenley. Heirbrandt noted the plaque will be presented to the City of Noblesville tomorrow at 7:00 p.m. and on January 17th to the City of Fishers. He is still working on setting a date and time for Senator Kenley.

Noblesville Downtown District Committee Appointment

Stevens reported the City of Noblesville has requested the Commissioners appoint a representative to serve on the newly formed Downtown District Committee. Altman moved to appoint Dan Stevens with Dillinger as backup. Heirbrandt seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

School Choice Week

Stevens reported Mr. Andrew Campanella has asked the Commissioners to recognize January 22-28 as School Choice Week in Hamilton County. No motion was made. Dillinger asked Stevens to send a letter to Mr. Campanella explaining that this is not within the county's jurisdiction.

Video Camera Upgrade Project

Stevens reported the Video Camera Upgrade Project Committee met with RQAW on Friday, January 6th to develop a consensus on bid alternates for the project. A list of questions has been created to clarify with Stanley Securities and a recommendation and contract will be presented to the Commissioners at their January 23, 2017 meeting.
