

- **Crisis Intervention:** Advocates are available 24 hours per day, 365 days per year to provide crisis intervention by phone and, when safe to do so, in person. This includes on-site response to area hospitals, when necessary.
- **Support Groups:** Prevail staff facilitate approximately 12 support groups per week to provide restorative services to adult, adolescent and child victims of domestic and sexual assault, along with parents of child victims of sexual assault.
- **Individual Services:** Advocates meet with adult, adolescent, and child clients individually to address safety planning, action plans, referrals, Violent Crime Compensation, court accompaniment, and other needs as identified by the client.
- **Police Reports:** Follow-up on police reports from five county jurisdictions offering Prevail's programs or services to victims or referrals for other services.
- **Employment Services:** In order to promote self-sufficiency and in response to clients' identified need, Prevail staff provide support with resume writing, job search and placement, and job support for victims of crime and abuse.
- **Victim Notification Services:** An advocate acts as a liaison between the prosecutor's office and victim services. Staff provide updates of court hearings and charges filed, court support and accompaniment, as well as referrals for services.
- **Victim Impact Panel:** Prevail coordinates Victim Impact Panels which are mandatory for those arrested in Hamilton County for driving a car while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Panelists share their experiences about how they have been affected by drunk driving in hopes of deterring further incidents and saving lives.
- **Safe Dates:** Prevail staff deliver the Safe Dates curriculum in local middle schools to educate students on dating violence and healthy relationship in hopes of preventing future violence.
- **Community Education:** In order to achieve our mission of preventing crime and abuse, we believe in educating the community about victim issues. A comprehensive community response to violence through education, advocacy, and appropriate intervention is necessary to bring about change and end the violence.

Dear Hamilton County Commissioners:

Attached is our 2015 budget and funding request for the 2015 service contract between the Humane Society for Hamilton County (HSHC) and Hamilton County (the jurisdiction of HCSD). In summary, we are requesting the amount of **\$94,045**. This is a decrease of \$379 from the 2014 budget request.

Our animal count calculations are based on a 29-month rolling average which is then used to determine each municipality's percentage of use of the total budget request. Our county budget request represents 27% of our total operating budget for 2015, down from 29% in 2014.

As a service contract, this is a fixed amount for 2015 for which Hamilton County (HCSD) will not be charged **anything additional** should the budgeted number of stray/owner surrendered animals be exceeded, nor will the Humane Society for Hamilton County refund any monies should the budgeted number of animals not be reached.

As always, this amount does not include the cost for animals that are seized by the Hamilton County Sheriff's Department and held for investigation or those on a court ordered hold for a period beyond 7 days, nor does it cover any medical expenses HSHC should incur while an animal is on a police/court ordered hold. Extended stay cases will be invoiced to Hamilton County for reimbursement within 30 days of final determination of the particular case.

Your support of HSHC means much more to the residents of Hamilton County than simply having a safe place to take stray animals or those they can no longer keep. HSHC is committed to providing educational programs to our community's youth and offering discounted or free programs to individuals in need. **The following programs are 100% funded by the Humane Society for Hamilton County:**

- **Our Pets Healing Vets Program** pairs veterans returning from active duty suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder or a Traumatic Brain Injury with a companion animal. The program is completely free to the veteran and includes free training support for the life of the pet. As funds permit, we will also cover any medical expenses these animals may need after adoption. The Humane Society for Hamilton County is the only organization in the state of Indiana, and one of the few in the country, offering this type of support program to qualifying Indiana veterans ([www.petshealingvets.com](http://www.petshealingvets.com).) This program has received national media exposure.
- Free behavior and training counseling for county residents to prevent animals from being surrendered at the tax payers' expense.
- Free pet microchipping made possible by our Corporate Partnerships to help lost pets be returned to their owners *before* entering the shelter and to help prevent dumping at the tax payers' expense.
- Our partnership with Good Samaritan of Hamilton County provides free pet food to Hamilton County residents dealing with financial difficulties. Our goal is to keep animals in loving homes instead of being surrendered at the tax payers' expense.
- Free temporary boarding and medical support for pets belonging to seniors who live alone and need to be hospitalized for a short time, victims of house fires, victims of domestic abuse and those involved in car accidents with pets inside the vehicle.

Currently, Janus Developmental Services, Inc. operates Hamilton County Express (HCE) through a 5311 Grant. The Hamilton County Express bus service has been in operation since January 2006. Hamilton County Express operates as a shared ride, demand responsive service throughout the entirety of Hamilton County. The demand responsive service is offered on a first-come, first-serve basis. The service requires 24 hour notice for scheduling. The service currently runs from 6:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, and from 7:00 A. M. to 3:00 P.M. on Saturday. The cost is \$5.00 per adult one way trip and \$2.00 per student one way trip. A \$55.00 pass is available for one month of unlimited rides, There is a \$40 student pass available for one month of unlimited rides. There is also a \$20.00 pass available for four rides. The service creates opportunities for individuals to take advantage of all Hamilton County has to offer. Demand response requests from Hamilton County residents, into and out of Marion County, are now served from five Indy Go bus stop locations.

Most importantly, people have needed transportation to and from work as well as to other essential services such as to and from medical, dental and therapy appointments. Without adequate accessibility to transportation, many individuals cannot access services vital to their health and well-being. Hamilton County residents also are able to shop at grocery stores and frequent other businesses in our community. - **Transportation:** Through this essential program, elderly citizens who are unable to drive are linked with vital resources and services provided by PLE or others. The service involves an initial assessment and subsequent Door-to-Door Demand/Response Transportation, as often as required to meet individual needs. Scheduled like a particularly accommodating taxi service, it is both challenging to schedule and costly to provide. Trips usually involve one vehicle and driver dedicated to one person, with return trips from medical appointments particularly challenging because of uncertain return times. However, our clients require this customized method. Hamilton County Express provides a similar service, but requires curbside pick-up which most of our clients cannot manage without assistance. Most require hands on assistance, and many require a wheelchair lift to enter and exit the vehicle. Our driver accompanies the client from his or her door to a specific destination within a building or hospital. With the client's permission, Drivers will also enter dwellings to provide additional assistance such as help transferring to a travel wheelchair or carrying parcels. Transport is primarily provided to medical appointments, but also to volunteer activities, employment, beauty/barber shops, senior centers, groceries, banks, etc.
- **Case Management/Community Outreach:** Seniors receive one-on-one help to obtain vital services such as energy assistance, housing, or medical attention, and emergency intervention in crisis situations (pending evictions, utility shut-off, etc.) from an MSW level social worker. This program includes: **State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)** – Volunteer counselors, trained by the Indiana Department of Insurance, help with Medicare and other insurance issues. **Caregiver & Bereavement Support** – Group meetings and individual support, including caregiver respite, counseling and education. **Information and Referral** – PLE is the primary information source for Hamilton County seniors, including referrals to appropriate resources and follow-up to ensure that needs are met.
- **In-Home Assistance:** Services provided in client homes include: **Assistance to the Homebound** – Trained volunteers offer support, companionship and assistance to those who are alone or in need of help. **Respite and Attendant Care** – In-Home aides provide relief for the full-time caregiver. Non-medical assistance is also provided to those who live alone, but need help with activities of daily living, and help with house cleaning, laundry, meal preparation, shopping, errands, and other household tasks.
- **PrimeLife Enrichment Center:** Featuring an indoor pool and walking track, and focusing on wellness, lifelong learning, and peer interaction, the Center offers exercise programs, dancing, computer instruction, art and other classes, games and social events, seminars, health screenings, and more for adults age 21 and older. The Center also houses: **Craft & Re-Sale Shop/Art Exhibit** – These
